



## **Ingo Meitinger**

Ingo Meitinger is the Head of Training and International Cooperation at the Swiss Federal Institute of Intellectual Property, Ministry of Justice. In this function, he is responsible for all IP training activities of the Institute within Switzerland as well as for the technical cooperation projects with third countries the Institute is in charge of or involved in. In this capacity, he is teaching extensively at various Universities within Switzerland as well as abroad.

Ingo Meitinger is also a lecturer of international intellectual property at the University of Berne, Switzerland and he publishes regularly on trade-related intellectual property issues.

Prior to his current position, Ingo Meitinger was Deputy Head of International Trade Relations of the Institute and as such a regular chief negotiator for intellectual property in economic co-operation and free trade agreements of Switzerland, as well as of the European Free Trade Association (EFTA).

Before, Ingo Meitinger worked as an attorney-at-law for an international law firm in Zurich, Switzerland and as a research fellow of Prof. Thomas Cottier at the Institute of European Law and Public Economic Law of the University of Berne, Switzerland. He holds a Master of Law from the University St. Gallen, Switzerland and a Doctor iuris (Dr. iur.) from the University of Berne on international and regional law (awarded with the Walther Hug Foundation Prize).
